AB 203: Valley Fever Train the Trainer



Thursday, April 23, 2020

On October 10, 2019, Governor Newsom signed into law AB 203. This bill requires a construction employer with employees working at worksites where Valley Fever is highly endemic to provide specific training on Valley Fever to their employees. The highly endemic worksites include but are not limited to the counties of Fresno, Kern, Kings, Madera, Merced, Monterey, San Joaquin, San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara, Tulare and Ventura. If you are a construction employer and conduct work in any of these 11 counties where the work activities disturb the soil including but not limited to digging, grading, or other earth moving operations, or vehicle operation on dirt roads, on high winds this applies to you. Training must be conducted by May 1, 2020. Please join us as we review the regulation and the required information you must train your employees on before they work in areas where Valley Fever might be present.
